








Eddy House is a daytime drop-in center and overnight shelter for homeless, runaway, foster, and other at-risk youth. No one who comes to Eddy House for assistance is turned away. From outreach to aftercare, Eddy House meets youth where they're at and will help them reach their goals through individualized case plans.

Our 24-hour facility includes a drop-in center, an overnight shelter for up to 38 young adults, a results-oriented residential program for 29 individuals, and transitional housing for 16 youth. Through various programs, services, and partnerships, Eddy House provides vital life skills classes, workforce development, healthcare assistance, counseling, and more.



PROGRAMS

Eddy House provides at-risk and homeless youth with a safe haven and access to a wide range of recovery-focused programs and services designed to help them attain employment, housing, and long-term stability. These programs and services encompass basic needs (restrooms, showers, clothing, food, water), emergency shelter, transitional housing, counseling, individual therapy, group therapy, substance use recovery, life skills coaching, financial literacy, mentoring, trauma-informed services, healthcare, dental care, vision care, educational attainment, workforce training and development, and access to employment. We partner with numerous nonprofits, businesses, units of government, schools, and community volunteers to assist our clients and offer them a path to successful, independent lives.

OUTREACH:

In collaboration with local aid groups, Eddy House conducts outreach 5+ times weekly to youth and other people experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness in our community's downtown areas, parks, campsites, motels, and other organizations.

DROP-IN SHELTER:

Young adults can access an emergency cot in our drop-in shelter. After staying in our low-barrier shelter room, we encourage individuals to apply for our supportive residential program so that they can develop permanence, life skills, and begin saving money.

COMMUNITY LIVING PROGRAM:

Once our clients have been accepted into our sober-living CL program, our case managers, therapists, and youth advocates help individuals develop career and educational goals as well as health and lifestyle routines. As our residents increase their independence, they graduate through our program and begin preparing for independent housing or our transitional living program.

TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM:

Now that our clients have demonstrated commitment to work, school, and achieving their goals, they can apply to live in one of our transitional houses. Here, they will begin paying affordable rent, continue engaging with case managers, and take the next steps towards independence.

LETTER FROM THE CEO

Ten years of service to the Northern Nevada Community—this is a milestone Eddy House reached last fall. For the last ten years, Eddy House has served thousands of homeless and at-risk youth in Northern Nevada. Our goal has always been to help these young people develop the life and job skills necessary for sustainable independence. It is our mission. As Eddy House has risen to the occasion, so has our community. In January 2020, we opened our emergency shelter and began to offer services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. For many in our community, the last two years have been challenging, but we have risen to the occasion: throughout the pandemic we were able to maintain our staff, increase our impact, and serve more youth in Northern Nevada.

Eddy House continues to be our community's largest and most comprehensive youth homeless service provider. We are committed to ending youth homelessness in our community and surrounding areas with the help of our strategic partnerships. In 2022 we will achieve our goal to help any young person experiencing a crisis to find permanent housing and sustainable employment with the help of our service continuum. However, this is only made possible due to your continued support.

We rely on government officials, community advocates, business leaders, faith-based organizations, volunteers, and philanthropists to share in our vision to end homelessness in Northern Nevada. Our new research-supported programs and services are placing the tools for positive life changes in the hands of our young people. We continue to see more homeless youth who enter our shelter, complete our community living program, and move toward transitional housing. They are making great strides on the path toward independence. Thank you for being part of their success!

However, the work is not done yet—we continue to see an increase in the number of youth in our area experiencing homelessness, and we need you to continue to be part of the solution. Thank you for your continued support of the next generation.







2020 Race and Ethnicity






2021 Race and Ethnicity

OVERVIEW OF NATIONAL WORK

In Fall 2020, Eddy House was honored to join two national initiatives that increase resources for our clients and staff.

On October 1, 2020, Eddy House joined the Runaway Homeless Youth initiative of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. "RHY," a program of the Administration of Children and Families, provides a nationwide forum for participants to share ideas, discuss emerging trends, and benefit from each other's experiences. During 2020, RHY's annual conferences were conducted virtually; this year, the plan (tentatively!) is to resume in-person conferences so that attendees can network with their peers from other regions.

On October 23, 2020, Eddy House officially became an EnVision Center – a new program of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. EnVision Centers are centralized hubs that provide recovery-based services centering on economic empowerment, educational advancement, health and wellness, and character and leadership.

Eddy House was the first Envision Center in Nevada and the first youth-focused Center in the United States. Being part of the national conversation around youth homelessness has connected us with innovative programs being implemented by sister agencies around the country. Access to technical assistance through the EnVision Center partnership was especially important in overcoming the operational challenges caused by COVID-19.

KEYS TO GREATER HELPS AT-RISK YOUTH FACING HOMELESSNESS

Greater Nevada Mortgage (GNM), a wholly owned subsidiary of Greater Nevada Credit Union, launched the Keys to Greater program in January 2021. Keys to Greater allocates a portion of the proceeds of every new GNM home loan and refinance to helping homeless, and at-risk youth find sustainable shelter, security, and independence.
